

Do I need to register my fish farm under the requirements of the Great Lakes Compact legislation?

Groundwater Pumping

1. Is the combined pumping capacity of all the wells on your property greater than 70 gallons per minute?

If you answered **yes**, you need to register your facility.

Surface Water Sources Only

1. Do you redirect or remove water from a stream, pond or lake via a pipe, channel, flume, diversion dam or other structural means?
2. Does the water which is redirected through your facility flow at an average rate that is greater than 70 gallons per minute?

If you answered **yes to both** of these questions, you need to register your facility.

Combined Water Sources

1. Does your facility have sources of water (e.g., wells, surface water redirection, etc.) other than precipitation, surface runoff and natural groundwater inflow? (Note: Water supplied by a public water supply does not count as a withdrawal so it should not be considered as a source of water.)
2. Does the combined pumping rate of your wells plus the amount of surface water which is redirected into your facility and any other sources exceed 70 gallons per minute?

If you answered **yes to both** of these questions, you need to register your facility.
